From the desk of Pastor Ron Mellor

In preparing for the next message in the "Be Joyful" series in the book of Philippians, I came across an idea that really jumped out at me. The first part of Philippians 4:5 says "Let your gentleness be evident to all." It struck me that, as believers, people should look at us who bear the name of Christ and note that we possess gentleness.

We live in a world where gentleness is not evident. Whether the arena of politics, sports, societal attitudes, and even too often in Christian churches, gentleness can be quite lacking. Gentleness, a mildness of disposition, is not natural for human nature. Rather, it is a Godly trait. However, as God's born again, adopted children, having become a new creation (2 Corinthians 5:17) who now live by the Spirit and not by the flesh, God wants us to live our lives with gentleness.

The importance of a gentle disposition is underscored quite often by the apostle Paul in Scripture:

- Be completely humble and gentle. (Ephesians 4:2) NIV
- As God's chosen people ... clothe yourselves with ... gentleness. (Colossians 3:12) NIV
- But the fruit of the Spirit is ... gentleness. (Galatians 5:22, 23) NIV



However, the best example of gentleness is that of Jesus Christ! Jesus' invitation to us is, "... Learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart." (Matthew 11:29) Gentleness was more than just talk to Him. At the most intense time of His life just before His crucifixion, as He was having insults hurled at Him and was being falsely accused, our Savior demonstrated a gentle spirit. (Matthew 27:12-14) The governor, Pilate, "marveled greatly" that Jesus did not even say a single word.

A Christ-like gentle disposition is not natural for us "sinnerlings." It is foreign to our flesh. However, gentleness can be learned, and the Holy Spirit that can transform a human heart from a cold "heart of stone" to a warm "heart of flesh." (Ezekiel 11:19) Our gentleness can be a great witness to the effect of the Holy Spirit living in our lives and will be like "bright stars shining in darkness!" (Philippians 2:16)

May our gentleness be evident to all! Pastor Ron Mellor



News from Our Pathfinder Club
