From the desk of Pastor Ron Mellor

During the summer of 1967, over 100,000 young free-spirited dreamers and activists converged on the San Francisco Bay Area. These young people who would become known as "hippies," traveled far and wide to form a community of artists, musicians, poets, and radicals. With flowers in their hair, their aim was to change the world, and they did so in significant ways influencing modern culture at that time through music and art, protesting war, promoting love and peace, and ushering in a new era of greater openness.

This coming summer of 2017 will mark the 50-year anniversary of this influential countercultural movement that took place in San Francisco's Haight-Ashbury neighborhood known as the *Summer of Love*. Events to celebrate this anniversary have been planned to commemorate this most interesting time of US history.

Starting this month of June, I am going to begin a message series that I am calling *Summer of Love.* On the 50th anniversary of the social phenomena of the flower children, we are going to look at the 10 Commandments in this message series. You may ask, "What does the 10 Commandments have to do with love?"

It has always been God's desire that we who are His children positively affect our culture for the advancement of the Kingdom. Jesus said it this way. Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven. Everyone will know that you are My disciples if you love one another. (Matthew 5:16; John 13:35) Let's make this summer, and the rest of our lives, a time of demonstrating the love of God in the way we live!





Religious Liberty Alert

Christians are the most persecuted group of people on the planet. Right now in Mosul, Iraq. The Islamic State (ISIS) is demanding that Christians convert to Islam. If they do not they are killed and their houses are then marked in red with a sign that reads "Property of Islam."

In 35 states within the US there are 134 bills waiting to be passed that in many cases take away control of immunizations from the people. Mandatory immunizations happen in 3rd world countries every day, often with dire consequences, and is a growing danger among freedom loving people. The National Immunization Center (nvic.org) tracks these bills and gives you the opportunity to help protect your right to choose, and that of your children, whether you agree to being immunized or not. Many of these bills take away your right to religious exemption.

The One True God is NOT interested in forcing anyone to do anything. HE gave us free will, because it is only when we are free that we can LOVE. No form of religious enforcement by civil powers is acceptable to God; in fact, the final crisis of this world, and the final attack upon God and His people will be brought about by such a union between church and state.
