From the desk of Pastor Ron Mellor

This is the way that the Bible puts it in 2 Timothy 3:1-3: "Remember that there will be difficult times in the Last Days. People will be ... violent and fierce." (Today's English Version)

Just last month a number of us from our church got a powerful reminder that we are indeed living in the "Last Days." On January 11, 2018, our "Church Safety Team," made up of Victor Green, Ron Matson, Jerry Miller, Bob Werner and Joe Williams along with certain leaders from our sister church in Eureka met there to attend an "Active Shooter Orientation." The present world we live in, with too many tragic shootings in American churches, has brought us face-to-face with the sobering truth that church shootings do happen and we would be foolish to think that it just never could happen in our church.

The presenters in this Active Shooter
Orientation were Officer Greg from the Eureka
Police Department and Katie, an Administrative
Assistant in the Eureka Police Department. In
addition to being a policeman, Greg is on the
local S.W.A.T. team and has served in the
military. Katie has experience with the dispatch
side of emergencies.

In their 90-minute presentation, many good points were brought up about how to respond to an active shooter emergency. In this training session, we viewed 2 videos and heard our presenters emphasize certain key points to be



aware of. To have a designated Church Safety Team that has been made aware of keeping their eves open for suspicious characters and knowing where the exits are, gives us a head start in reacting to anyone who might want to hurt or kill other people. The 3 main points that our presenters emphasized were: "Run, Hide, Fight." In the event that an active shooter would begin shooting, the first step should be to get away as soon as possible. Run! If it would be impossible to get outside the church building, then to hide somewhere and lock the door and turn out the lights would be the next step to take. Finally, if necessary, fight. Throw something, grab a chair as a weapon; anything that can be done to deter the attacker.

The thought of the necessity of an Active Shooter Orientation has somewhat conflicted me. I have given more than 4 decades of my life sharing the Good News of the gospel of peace. I have often spoken of my idea of church as a "safe place to hear a dangerous message." (The message of Jesus is a dangerous message because it does not leave you the same—it will completely change your life!) However, the reality is that we live in a very hostile and violent world, and Jesus has counseled us to be, "as wise as serpents and harmless as doves." (Matthew 10:16) The leadership of your church is doing our best to be responsible leaders and to take your safety seriously.



News from Our Pathfinder Club

The weekend of January 5–7 our Pathfinder Club hosted the Area 1 Winter Campout of 2018. Friday evening adults and young people from all the clubs participated in an Induction service. It is a solemn service wherein the Pathfinder Pledge and Law are reviewed in a candlelight service and all of us renewed our vows to follow the Pathfinder standards.

Eddie Heinrich, Northern CA Conference Youth Director, was in attendance and conducted the Friday evening worship and the early morning worship on Sabbath. Early in the morning the older Pathfinders in grades 8-10 did the flag raising in the gym.

Then the Pathfinders divided into groups depending on class work to study and earn a nature honor: Friends–Worms; Companions–Cacti; Explorers–Fossils; Rangers/Voyagers/Guide–Midnight Sunday.

Next the young people divided into groups to prepare Bible skits by class. I assisted the Explorers prepare an experience of a person in the early church from the Book of Acts. The older Pathfinders studied the 28 Fundamental Beliefs. By late morning, after performing the Bible skits, the Pathfinders went to the music room and began working on the Whistle Honor, various sections taught by staff from the five clubs (Humboldt Bay, Fortuna, Crescent City, Hayfork and Napa).

In the early afternoon we began studying the Standard First Aid honor which is an 8th grade level safety honor.

It included what to do in various emergencies and had hands-on components such as bandaging, splinting and carrying injured people.

During the late afternoon the Pathfinders continued working on the Whistle Honor and completed the flag lowering ceremony.

Pastor Ron Mellor had the evening worship and singing. After supper the Pathfinders continued the Standard First Aid Honor and finished up the Whistle Honor before going to bed in the gym.

In the early morning the Pathfinders who had not yet completed the Red Alert honor went to two stations and did all the requirements. Pathfinders who came to the campout with none of the honor patches were able to complete a maximum of five new honors during the weekend.

Our next big event is the Variety Hour at HBCS gym on Saturday night, February 3. We hope to see as many people as possible. Our Pathfinders will plan some skits and will serve food for sale for this fundraiser. Please attend.


