From the desk of Pastor Ron Mellor

In the year 1847, Ellen White said something that I personally believe is very significant. "I saw that God had children, who do not see and keep the Sabbath. ...We (Seventh-day Adventists) went forth and proclaimed the Sabbath more fully."

Although the precise nature of "proclaiming the Sabbath more fully" is not specified, it is made in the context of what will be done in the last days before Jesus comes. I would like to share what I think it might be referring to.

Ever since the late 1840s, Seventh-day Adventists have declared the 7th-day Sabbath. That means for over 170 years now Adventists have been proclaiming the truth of the 7th day Sabbath. Most of our effort, when it comes to "proclaiming the Sabbath" has been put into trying to prove it Biblically. And there is absolute clear and compelling Scriptural support for the 7th-day Sabbath!

Our modern times have seen a real shift in people's thinking. For many it is not adequate to just prove something to be true. People want to know how they will be personally benefited, made better, by what you are trying to convince them on.

Experience has become more important than facts to people in our modern culture. For the next few months I am going to be presenting a message series I am calling, "Experiencing the Benefit of the Sabbath."

The theme of this series will be done in a similar perspective that Jesus stated in Mark 2:27, "The Sabbath was made to meet the needs of people, and not people to meet the requirements of the Sabbath." In the New Living Translation, I believe that Christ was trying to point out that the 7th day Sabbath was never intended to be just a Bible teaching; merely a truth to intellectually know. Rather the Sabbath was additionally intended to be a real blessing, a benefit to people. By experiencing what the Sabbath has to offer, peoples lives were to be benefited and made better. And that is the angle that I will be taking in this series.

Could it be that what is involved in "proclaiming the Sabbath more fully" has to do with being able to share the type of message that Jesus gave in Mark 2:27? "The Sabbath was made to meet the needs of people" and to be a tremendous blessing and benefit! When understood this way, I believe that the Sabbath will have a tremendous appeal to people.
